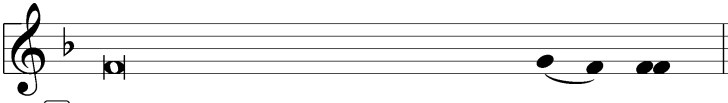


Prayer of Thanksgiving

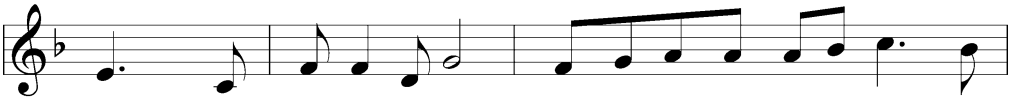
