From the Pastor: "For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." Romans 14:7-8

Will You Conduct My Funeral?

That's a question I first heard when I announced my impending retirement last spring. But I don't hear it so much anymore. I believe that's because you know – or should know – what the answer would be. If asked even now, I would say, "I would like to; but I can't when I'm no longer your pastor."

The relationship between a pastor and his congregation grows and develops over time, as does any human relationship. It is important for you to get to know your pastor and your pastor to become familiar with



you. We believe that Jesus is the Lord of the Church. He, of course, already knows who your next pastor will be. But now you don't. In due time, however, you will. And when that time comes it is important that you graciously welcome and receive him and allow him to serve you with the Word of God.

In that regard, the Rite of Installation, which will likely be officiated by either District President Mohr or Circuit Visitor Nerud, asks you these questions about your new pastor: "Will you receive him, show him that love, honor, and obedience in the Lord that you owe to the shepherd and teacher placed over you by your Lord Jesus Christ, and will you support him by your gifts and pray for him always that in his labors he may retain a cheerful spirit and that his ministry among you may be abundantly blessed.? Will you honor and uphold your pastor as he serves Christ in all his God-pleasing responsibilities? Will you aid him as he cares for his family? Will you be diligent to 'put the best construction on everything,' recognizing that 'love covers a multitude of sins?'"

When I pronounce the Benediction over you at my last service, I will no longer be your pastor. I will certainly still be your friend. I will certainly still think of you and pray for you. But I will then be your **former** pastor. The privileges and responsibilities of the office are no longer mine; they are my successor's. And should I meddle in those privileges and responsibilities, I am depriving the new pastor of an opportunity to draw closer to you and become more established in his ministry.

Some of you who are reading this might have a loved one die when Pastor Wright is serving after my departure, or in the early days of the new pastor's ministry. You might not know your vacancy pastor or your new pastor well, and they might not know you or your loved one well. But when you welcome them to conduct the funeral and share the message of Christ's victory over death, you will be setting a wonderful example for families that follow. In the first seven months of my ministry here I had ten funerals. I am grateful to those families for accepting me. In these past eighteen years I've conducted over two hundred funerals as the pastor of Holy Cross. Being at the bedside of your dying loved ones along with you, and sharing the precious message of the resurrection of the body and life everlasting through Jesus is one of the greatest privileges a pastor can have. For that, I thank you with my whole heart.

A Place Reserved for You

This year, the beginning of April also marks the beginning of the Easter season. By the time the calendar at the back of this newsletter is relevant, we will have celebrated the highest holy-day of the year, and with that we have the opportunity to look at a sort of in between time in Scripture. Today, Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father in heaven, as He has been since He ascended into heaven. when Jesus was raised from the dead, he did not immediately ascend into heaven, but persisted on earth for forty days in his resurrected and glorified body.

Jesus remained for this time, appearing personally to His disciples. They did not fully understand what his death and resurrection meant, so He being ever our good teacher and servant explained everything to them from the Scriptures concerning Himself. Jesus explained, as He had done so many times before, why He had to suffer, be crucified, buried and then finally be raised. Remember, that Jesus was not anxious as He prepared for His passion, rather He was resolute and determined to be arrested and put to death as the sacrifice for our sins. Jesus knew that He had a victory to look forward to over death



and the devil. Jesus knew that He had a resurrection waiting for Him. Jesus knew that He had a throne in heaven with His name on it. Jesus knew all along that He had a place reserved for Him.

Peter reminds us that God has a place reserved for us as well. Although we know that we are joined to Jesus in our baptism, and that we are justified through faith in Him, we know that we have not fully received everything promised. We are in a sort of in between time also, waiting for our eternal inheritance. We are waiting, as Peter says, being "kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." We too are waiting for the end of death and the devil's torment in our lives. We too are waiting for our bodies to be raised incorruptible. We too are waiting to take the places reserved for us in the presence of our God.

So while we wait to receive our inheritance, we have hope. This is not a wishful thinking sort of hope, but a hope that is built on something absolute and unshakable, even our Rock. We have a living hope in our living God. We have hope in the fact that just as Christ is raised from the dead, we who have Christ will also be raised from the dead. Just as God has made a place for His only begotten Son, He has also made a place for each of His children who are adopted by Baptism.


From the Youth Director/Sunday School Superintendent:


On Saturday, April 20 at 2 pm, the Sunday School will have a game day! Come and play games, hang out, and have snacks together.




