A No-vacancy Vacancy

This will be my second-last newsletter column as the pastor of Holy Cross Lutheran Church, Moline. Before I bid you farewell and express my gratitude to you in the June newsletter, I wanted to take the opportunity this month to



give you some words of encouragement. Pastoral vacancies can be times of uncertainty, anxiety, and sadly, sometimes even dissent. Members of the congregation wonder how long it will take for another full-time pastor to come. Schedules are often altered, because the vacancy pastor divides his time between his present place of service and the vacant congregation. Members may have different ideas of what the next pastor should be like. And sometimes, of course, not every Call that is issued will be accepted, and the congregation must repeat the process for a second, third, or even fourth time, as was the case in the Holy Cross vacancy of 2005-2006.

As we already know, Circuit Visitor Rev. Nerud has appointed Rev. Wright of Zion, Hampton to be the vacancy pastor when my ministry among you ends. Rev. Wright is eager to serve at Holy Cross and will be a faithful shepherd to you in whatever time he has in your midst. We are grateful to Zion Lutheran Church, Hampton for their willingness to share Pastor Wright with us. Because Zion is the "giving" congregation and Holy Cross is the "receiving" congregation, we graciously adjust to their schedule. But even as we will make concessions to their regular Sunday morning routine, so too are they willing to make concessions for us, moving the time of their Sunday morning Bible Class. And as you also already know, this means that beginning in July, there will be only one Sunday morning service at Holy Cross, beginning at 10:45. This change will be more pronounced for those of you who usually attended the 8:15 service than it will be for regular 10:45 attendees.

I urge you, however, not to look at the perils of a vacancy, but to focus instead on the positive aspects of this vacancy. When a death occurred in my early years at Holy Cross, I would sometimes hear the remark, *"I didn't know him/her; they must have attended the other service."* Two different service times can have the tendency to create two separate congregations. Although I don't think there is as much unfamiliarity with one another in our congregation now as in the past, one service **together** will provide the opportunity for each of you to know others better. Additionally, a sanctuary that is more fully filled for a single service than one which is more sparsely filled at two services will be another blessing.

The Bible passage at the top of this page is a Word from God that seems to be especially appropriate in the coming months. Please read it and apply it to your life. I pray that even as you deal with a pastoral vacancy, there will be no vacancies among members of Holy Cross, as you continue with your presence, by the power of the Spirit, to encourage one another and glorify our Savior.

Then you shall know that I am the Lord; I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the Lord." Ezekiel 37:10-14

Call night and vicarage assignment night have just passed at our seminaries as a new group of our men edge ever closer to serving the Church in the office of Holy Ministry. Jim Martin received his call to Grace Lutheran Church in Clarksville Tennessee, having been Holy Cross's 53rd vicar. God willing, this summer you will have the honor of knowing that your love, support, and prayers have seen yet another man take up the stole and enter into the prophetic office in the tradition of Luther, the apostles, and the prophets of old like Ezekiel.



This passage from Ezekiel will be part of our reading for our celebration of Pentecost later this month. Pentecost was a holy feast day

to God's people in ancient times, but it was fulfilled that day when God poured out His Holy Spirit over the Apostles and the disciples who had seen the Risen Lord. Jews from all over the known world were in Jerusalem that day for the observance. The city was filled with dry bones, a people ravaged by wars and persecutions, scattered far and wide, ruled over by an enemy. Here the Christians came and prophesied to a people who were yet dead in spirit, gathering for the regular observance of a rite of the Old Covenant, unaware as a corpse is unaware, that the Author of Life had walked these streets only weeks prior and that His gift of life had come.

Like Ezekiel before, Peter stood up and prophesied to these dry bones as the wind of the Spirit swept over the bodies of the dead. The breath of God passed to them by His Word and He put His Spirit in them. A dead nation immediately became a living army, the Church Militant, baptized and joyous, for what the Lord had spoken, so he accomplished. The resurrection of Jesus has become their resurrection. The open tomb speaks of the opening of every tomb, every mortuary, and every grave under a mound of earth. Death no longer impedes the pilgrimage of the faithful, it has fallen under Christ's feet. He will lead them into their land.

"Therefore prophesy" says the Lord, "Then you shall know that I am the Lord." By the power of God's Word, the Church is alive! Faithful pastors are sent to proclaim the Law and the Gospel of Jesus, the words of life run like the wind throughout the world. Christians take their rest, and more are born and baptized. Pastors retire and receive the reward of their service, and God sends more in behind them. The march to our promised land is underway. The Church is alive in Christ! In all of this, Jesus is preparing us for the resurrection of His Church, the multitude which no man can count. "I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the Lord."

From the Congregational President:

Thank you, Holy Cross, for your patience with the pace of addressing the upcoming vacancy. The respect this displays to Pastor and Lynette is appreciated very much.

Vacancies are a reality in the life of a congregation. Given the existing and growing shortage of pastors within Synod the frequency and duration of vacancies are increasing too.

The good news is that we have Rev. Gary Wright an ordained, experienced, dedicated, caring, confessional Lutheran Pastor to serve us during this vacancy.

He is also the called Pastor of Zion Hampton (within our circuit) which means both congregations will be sharing his time.

Here are two points from our Synodical Handbook to guide our thoughts.

- "Congregations that have joined Synod have thereby also agreed to work with the officers of Synod, specifically the District President and his representative on the circuit level, the Circuit Visitor, to guide and assist them in their vacancy and calling procedure, so that the interests of the entire work of the Kingdom may be served in accordance with the objectives of our Synod."
- 2) "The calling congregation is to adjust its schedule to the situation of the Vacancy Pastor."

Rev. Wright, the leadership of Zion Hampton, our Elders, Vicar Corrigan, Pastor Karsten and Rev. Nerud, Circuit Visitor met April 10th to discuss worship and functional aspects of the vacancy. This is what has been decided thus far. There may be adjustments if a need arises.

- Sunday morning Bible Class & Sunday School at 9:30, worship service w/communion at 10:45.
- Wednesdays; 8 12 office hours, 9:00- 10:00 Bible Class and committee meetings in the afternoon/early evenings.
- Confirmation class day/time determined by parents/students and Pastor Wright.
- Hospital visits, shut in visits, 1 on 1 conversations with Pastor Wright, etc. will be scheduled as needed.
- Friday is Pastor Wright's Day off.

The call committee met Thursday, April 25th and chose Tom Stuenkel, Chairman and Marcia Green, Secretary.

In this newsletter is a "Nomination Form for Suggested Pastor" provided by the Central Illinois District. Additional copies are in the atrium and church office. Please use this form to submit a Pastor's name. Return the form to the church office by Sunday, May 26th. All names (forms) will be forwarded to President Mohr for his consideration as he prepares the call list for Holy Cross. From President Mohr's list the call committee will present the top four (4) candidates and recommend two (2) candidates to the Voters Assembly.

We have 5 names for organists. Two have already agreed to serve on a rotational basis. I will be contacting the others this week to request their service.

Please keep in mind that there may be changes to what is written above to accommodate and maintain our activities and work within the schedules of our servants. Respectfully, *Don Freeman*

In Mexico Mothers' Day is always celebrated on May 10th. It is the most beloved and important festival of the year for the family. It is a tradition that the children sing songs to their mothers on this day. We call it "serenata". A serenata consists of songs sung in the early morning with live music. Some hire a group of musicians with acoustic guitars. Others employ "The Mariachi", (The Mariachi is a group of musicians who play traditional folk music with guitars, trumpets, and violins). Or friends with acoustic guitars may form a group and travel to their mothers' houses and sing two or three songs. Upon finishing the songs, the mother must leave the house and thank the children personally with a hug and a kiss.

On this day, the mothers also receive gifts: flowers, hugs, kisses, and a lot of love from their children in appreciation. It is also a custom to observe festivals for the mothers in the elementary schools, where the

students carry out dance numbers, interpret some songs and perform some recitations like poems for mothers. Mothers are so pleased when they see their children doing something for them. In many schools the students do some handcrafts, like decorations for the house for their mothers. Children give it to them on Mother's Day, May 10.

Many families are accustomed to being together to celebrate with their moms. They bring a special meal or some plates while others make reservations in a restaurant. The idea is to spend major time with their moms in order to honor



them on their special day. At Cristo Rey we are going to celebrate Mothers' Day and give gifts on Sunday, May 12th.
