What is the importance of Holy Baptism?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus:



A man lies in the recovery room after serious, lifesaving heart surgery. The surgeon walks into the room and gets down on his knees beside the bed. With tears in his eyes the doctor says, "Thank you! Thank you! I can't thank you enough for what you have done for me!"

There's something backwards about that scene. Shouldn't the patient be the one thanking the doctor? After all, that surgeon saved his life. The patient owes that medical man a huge debt of gratitude. There's something backwards here!

Did you know that many people get Christian Baptism backwards? Many Christians (on the Reformed side of Christianity) think that Baptism is something WE DO for God, a way of showing obedience to him. That may SEEM appropriate. After all, parents are the ones who bring their children to the baptismal font. But in truth, in Baptism GOD is really the one who does something FOR US. That's the Lutheran (Biblical) understanding of Holy Baptism!

And what wonderful things God does for us in Baptism! The apostle Peter said, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38). In those words, Peter describes two of the wondrous blessings of Baptism: the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). We are all sinners. Sin separates us from God. Sin takes away the blessings God wants us to have. Sin keeps us out of heaven. So, God did something about sin. He sent Jesus, his Son. Jesus lived perfectly in our place, died on the cross to pay for all our sins and rose again to assure us of eternal life. In Baptism, God gives us this forgiveness that Jesus won for us. It really has NOTHING to do with us at all! We merely receive from a loving and gracious God; hence, Baptism is ALL GOSPEL—a Means of Grace, not a work of the LAW.

The other blessing, the gift of the Holy Spirit, is faith or trust in Jesus. Faith is the hand that receives all the blessings that Jesus won for us. In Baptism God miraculously works faith in our hearts so that we don't miss out on a single blessing that Jesus won for us. Through faith worked in Baptism, God gives us all the blessings earned by our Savior: forgiveness of sins, a new life of peace and hope, and eternal life in heaven.

Is Baptism important? You better believe it is! In Baptism God is at work for us. Through Baptism God saves us. This month at Holy Cross, we'll be blessed to see several souls launched heavenward, as God begins His good work in their lives through water and the Word! What a joy to see the family of God grow and expand! It's all God's doing. All glory to Him alone!



Dear Holy Cross,

President Mohr provided us a list of 20 pastoral candidates. One candidate accepted a call the week of Aug 12th 2024 reducing the list to 19. This is a remember the list is not fixed and subject to change.

Voters, at the December 2023 Assembly, entrusted the call committee to condense the call list and present four candidates to the Assembly. The call committee at their 6th meeting, Friday, August 16th completed the assignment.

The quarterly Voters Assembly @ 2:30 pm Sunday, September 22, 2024 will consider the candidates and God willing extend a divine call.

Information needed for an informed decision can be evaluated in the church office during business hours. Opportunities to evaluate the information outside of office hours will be by appointment. Several identical folders in the office contain the following:

- 1. Summary of Pastoral Skills as identified by a congregational evaluation completed in November 2023. This document is in the back of the folder.
- 2. A Pastoral Information File (PIF) and Self Evaluation Tool (SET) for each of the *four* candidates. *Please respect the sensitive nature of this information*. Parishioners may make personal notes, but not photocopy, scan or photograph the documents.
- 3. The call list is included. The PIF/SET for one of the other candidates may be viewed upon request.

Each candidate has an online presence. A password protected page w/links to all 19 candidates is on the Holy Cross home page. This resource has limitations. Some candidates have a smaller online presence. The information online is not all inclusive. "For example 1-on-1 personal ministry, such as grief or marital pastoral care, etc. will not, for obvious reasons, be found "online." The link for this page and the password will be shared directly with the voters.

Our Circuit Visitor is the point of contact for all questions not answered by PIF/SET or online information. *Please respect the relationship a pastoral candidate has with his current parish and display Christian concern for a sister congregation by not individually contacting a candidate or his church.*


Held in the fellowship hall on Wednesday's at 9am. You do not need to start at the beginning of a unit or topic. Please come whenever you can.



I'm not saying that I am opposed to parties or dances, but we need to determine priorities correctly.

For people who do not attend worship, it's so easy to reject the invitation to come to church, right? People who used to go to church but aren't faithful in attendance, might say, "Maybe next week or when I have a certain feeling in my heart". I'm sure that you can add even more excuses that you have heard.

According to God's Word, if we go to church, it's because the Holy Spirit put that desire in our hearts. We remember that we aren't perfect or better than the people who don't attend. As sinners we come to church to receive God's forgiveness. As I recently told one of my contacts; "I'm in front of you as the first sinner to arrive at church and the last forgiven one to leave because I have the key to unlock the church building and then lock it again".

Let's go to church and worship our merciful Lord and receive that spiritual rest that only He can give!
