

#### Pastor's Newsletter Article for October 2024

#### Why is the Bible called the Holy Bible?

Prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit. - 2 Peter 1:21



"One more book, Daddy! Please!" my children would tell me (many years ago now) as they looked at me with pleading eyes, while holding up their favorite books. It's amazing how many books we read in a single sitting, everything from: *If You Give a Mouse a Cookie*, to *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See*? to *The Berenstain Bears* series, to *Goosebumps*. These books contain short stories that hold the attention of the listener (and sometimes the reader) while providing some entertainment or education along the way.

We read for many reasons. And we know that most of the things we read whether online, in the newspaper, or in a book must be read with a discerning eye. The problem is that we sometimes struggle to know which parts of them are real and true.

This can be a challenge. But what about when it comes to the Bible, the HOLY Bible. Well, that is another story, isn't it? Why? Throughout Scripture we are told that God's Word is different. What makes it different? The author is God. Yes, men wrote the Bible but God is the main author. It is his holy, perfect Word.

God tells us some remarkable truths about his Word such as: God's Word cannot be broken—everything it says is reliable (John 10:35b). His Word is truth—why would God lie to us? (John 17:17). His Word is sharp—it can pierce through the hardest of hearts (Hebrews 4:12). His Word is alive—it is active (John 6:63). His Word is powerful (Romans 1:16). His Word always achieves God's purpose (Isaiah 55:11). His Word will never pass away (Isaiah 40:8; 1 Peter 1:25).

While these truths are important to note, it is the message of God's Word that can't be overlooked. For God says that the purpose of the Bible, the HOLY Bible, is for us to know that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing we may have life in his name (John 20:31).

The Bible is HOLY. But you have to open and use it to get anything out of it. If you want to change a heart or be comforted by God's grace, you have to "blow off the dust" and share or listen to the HOLY words of our God. These are the words that he authored through men, for you, to tell you about his great love and saving activity in Jesus, so that through the encouragement of the Scriptures you might have hope. I am so very much encouraged as I see so many members of Holy Cross involved in Bible Study with Pastor Brondos and myself. As we move deeper into autumn and life begins to fall into a routine, let me encourage you to make time for study with your fellow members of the Body of Christ and personal daily Bible reading and meditation. It's an investment in your spiritual growth and will bring immeasurable blessings into your life. Studying God's Word is like embarking on an exciting adventure. You'll encounter new truths, deepen your relationship with God, and find answers to life's questions. Immerse yourself in its pages and discover the incredible riches God has for you. There's no other book like it. That's why we call it HOLY!


Held in the fellowship hall on Wednesday's at 9am. You do not need to start at the beginning of a unit or topic. Please come whenever you can.



#### Newsletter OCTOBER 2024

#### Prison Ministry.

In August 2006 I began a new, additional ministry as a volunteer chaplain at the East Moline Correctional Center. I went to the prison three Fridays per month, from 6-8 p.m. I had the opportunity to do Bible studies with the Hispanic inmates. The first time I went in August, I saw many inmates but no Hispanics. We entered the building, and the other volunteer chaplains went to their classrooms with their inmates. I sat in a chair, but nobody came. I read my Bible while I waited. One hour later and still no Hispanics came. Another half hour passed. At 7:35 a Hispanic man approached and asked, "Are you the Hispanic chaplain?" "Yes, I am" I answered. He replied, "Last Friday, there was no chaplain here." I said, "Well this is my first time here." The man turned his head to the crowd and shouted: "Hey, spread the word, the Spanish chaplain is here, and we'll have a Bible study". Then he ran and disappeared. Five minutes later, ten Hispanics came to the building and the stern guard shouted at them: "Where are you going? Do you think it is possible to have a Bible study in ten minutes?" Then a man said: "No, but we can pray". We walked to the hall, and I shared a brief meditation, and we prayed for their needs. When I opened my eyes, I saw that they were comforted and now had enthusiastic faces. Each of them shook my hand and said "Thank you for coming here"

Another Friday I went to the prison, and I noticed that I was the only chaplain. The guard said, "Will you conduct the English and Spanish Bible study today?" "Yes, I will" I answered. At this moment I prayed "God, I came to share the Good News with these people, now they want me to do it in English. I'll do it, but God You know that I don't speak fluent English. I trust in You and my soul is Yours" After a short ride in a car, I arrived at the chapel. I saw Afro-Americans, Hispanics and Anglos. Then one Hispanic said to me: "Pastor Dominguez, I will be your translator today, don't worry". God answered my prayer right in front of my eyes. That Friday evening was a blessing for all, especially me! *(This story was written in my NEWSLETTER OCTOBER 2006)* 

And now in 2024, 15-20 Hispanics attend the Bible Study every Thursday. They are learning about Jesus' love and the Good News. Please keep them, the chaplains and the volunteers in your prayers. What a wonderful opportunity God has given us to lead people to Christ!


